Overview.

The University of Arizona Pediatric Pulmonary Center (UAPPC) trains health care professionals and helps children with respiratory conditions in Dept. of Health and Human Services – Region 9: Arizona, California, Federated States of Micronesia, Hawaii, Nevada, Samoa, Marshall Islands, Guam, Mariana Islands and Palau.

The UAPPC also conducts outreach clinics to Tuba City, Fort Defiance and Chinle, Arizona as well as local clinics.
