

CF RESEARCH UPDATE

The CF clinical research team is excited to share that our center is actively participating in and recruiting for several new research studies. Currently we are working on Vertex VX-445-102 and 103 studies that are looking at people over the age of 12 with at least one deltaF508 mutation in a study of a triple combination drug to treat the underlying disease. This study is fully enrolled, but we are also starting two studies with another company, Proteostasis, that has its own drug combination to treat the underlying disease. We also are starting a new study to have people use a new mobile app for medication and therapy reminders to see whether or not this would be a useful tool. We will be telling you about these studies in clinic, so be ready. Lots of exciting new things coming this way.
